EXHIBIT G

Reporting of Procurement Results

Information regarding the results of the procurement would be publicly released after each solicitation. Further, additional information would be released publicly after all the solicitations for a given supply period have been conducted.

- 1. After each solicitation for which full-requirements products are procured, release the following information for full-requirements products:
 - the average bid price for each class;
 - the rate impact for each class;
 - the number of suppliers that qualified to submit bids;
 - the number of suppliers that won; and
 - the number of tranches of each product that were filled.

The average bid price and the rate impact for a class are released as long as supply for at least 10 tranches has been procured for that class. If, in a given solicitation, there are fewer than 10 tranches procured for a class, the average bid price and rate impact across all classes are released instead. For the residential class, the average bid price for the full requirements products is used to calculate rate impacts. The information is released 30 days after the solicitation, or 21 days before the supply period starts, whichever comes earlier.

- 2. After each solicitation for which block products are procured, release the following information for block products:
 - the average bid price for baseload blocks and for peak blocks;
 - the number of suppliers that qualified to submit bids; and
 - the number of blocks of each product that were filled.

The average bid price is released for baseload as long as supply for at least 8 blocks has been procured for baseload. The average bid price is released for peak as long as supply for at least 8 blocks has been procured for peak. If, in a given solicitation, there are fewer than 8 blocks procured for peak or baseload, the average bid price across both peak and baseload is released instead. The information is released 30 days after the solicitation, or 21 days before the supply period starts, whichever comes earlier.

- 3. Once all the solicitations for a given supply period have been completed, release:
 - the average bid price for each product;

- the rate impact for each class;
- the number of tranches or blocks of each product that were filled;
- the number of suppliers that qualified to submit bids in each solicitation;
- the number of winners over all solicitations;
- the number of tranches of each product awarded to each winner; and
- (for full requirements products) the percentage of each class awarded to each winner.

The information is released 30 days after the last solicitation for a given supply period, or 21 days before the supply period starts, whichever comes earlier. For the residential class, the average bid price for the full requirements products is used to calculate rate impacts.
